



## Immigration Enforcement Protocols and Contacts

The presence of ICE or other federal agencies operating on campus have the potential to cause significant concern for the wellbeing of our students and staff. As a public, state institution, immigration enforcement agents are allowed on our campus.


While it is normal to have some Federal Law Enforcement Agencies on campus performing employment background checks, we ask that anyone who sees federal law enforcement, immigration enforcement, or unidentified law enforcement on or near campus notify Public Safety. This notification is important in helping to confirm any presence or activity and determine whether it requires campus notification and response.

We understand that under stress, it can be hard to remember response procedures. Below are three simple instructions to keep in mind should you encounter immigration or unidentified enforcement on campus:

1. **Under the [Keep Washington Working Act](#), the college may not inquire into or collect information about a person's citizenship**, immigration status, or place of birth, or provide information to federal immigration authorities in response to notification requests for the purposes of civil immigration enforcement.
2. **If you encounter immigration enforcement or unknown agency personnel, stay calm and contact public safety.** Authorized designees serve as the main contacts for immigration enforcement agents on our campus. Contacting Public Safety initiates our response procedures.
3. **For your safety and in order to prevent interfering with the officers**, you should not physically touch, impede, or stop them from their actions. We recommend remaining in private spaces such as classrooms and offices while they are on campus.
