HIGHLINE COLLEGE Affidavit of Eligibility for Resident Tuition Rate

Background

A Washington State law (RCW 28B.15.012) defines whether students can be considered residents of Washington and eligible to pay resident (in-state) tuition rates at public institutions. This law was revised in 2003 to include those students who meet the criteria below. In 2014, the state's financial aid laws were amended so that these students would also be eligible for need-based state aid (State Need Grant). Information on the State Need Grant is available at <u>Ready, Set, Grad</u>.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible under this option, a student must meet all three of the following:

- Completed high school in Washington whether by diploma or equivalent (if completed high school with a diploma, must have attended full senior year);
- Lived in Washington for at least three calendar years (36 months) immediately prior to completing high school;
- Continuously lived in the state of Washington after completing high school and until admission into college
