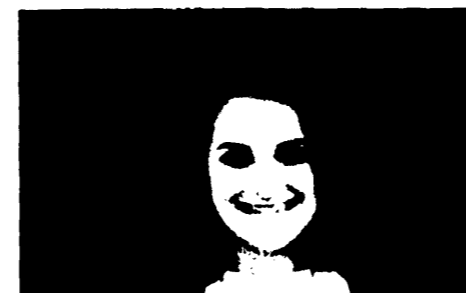
Wayne Carroll is a candidate for Sophomore President.
