
TRiO Student Support and Retention Services Program

TRiO provides opportunities for academic development, assists students with basic college requirements, and motivates students toward the successful completion of their postsecondary education. MEET Seoyeon Jo

Originally from Korea, Seoyeon Jo came to the U.S. in 2012 after being adopted by a family who had emigrated from Korea ten years earlier. "Learning everything new, including language and culture, was challenging," recalls Seoyeon.

Her early college experience was rough. "I felt alone and like I couldn't find community. During my second year at Highline, I met TRIO students in a biology course."

Meeting these students prompted her to join TRiO, where "for the first time I felt like I belonged."

Through TRiO, Seoyeon met new people by participating in campus events, built connections with counselors, and found new opportunities. "TRIO changed my life."

"TRiO counselors not only helped me to plan out my schedule but they were willing to listen to my stories, to understand what I was through, and they tried to give me honest and realistic feedback."

She is pursuing an associate of science in pre-nursing with plans on earning a bachelor of science in nursing, with the long-term goal of becoming a licensed nurse practitioner.

"With my knowledge about the healthcare community, I want to help families, mostly those who have low income or no insurance, so that they have easier access when they need to be diagnosed and treated for their illnesses."
