## WHAT IS THE HONORS PROGRAM?

The Highline Honors Program provides transfer, professional-technical, and bachelor-of-applied-science students with opportunities to prepare you for transfer and career success. To join the program students enroll in core Honors classes or transform their college-level classes into honors options. Honors options are advanced projects such as experiments, research papers, professional presentations, internships, creative expressions, or community collaborations—that complement and build upon students' college-level coursework. Through advanced projects, students gain valuable knowledge and skills in preparation for entering professional careers or for transferring to 4-year colleges or universities.

\*To be eligible for the Honors scholarship, students must successfully complete all Honors Program requirements prior to their last quarter of attendance at Highline College. The Honors scholarship funds tuition and fees only, with a maximum award of \$1,000. Students receiving financial aid must consult with the Financial Aid office before accepting a scholarship, as it may negatively affect the aid they receive. Running Start students are only eligible to receive the Honors scholarship in summer quarter, and all eligibility requirements for Running Start students must be completed prior to the end of spring quarter. Students can only receive the Honors scholarship once while attending Highline College.
