High School Enhancement Authorization

Purpose & Eligibility

High School Enhancement allows high school students to enroll in classes at Highline College with authorization from their high school. Students must be at least 15 years old on the first day of the quarter to enroll.

Steps to Apply & Register (steps 2 and 4 to be completed by new students only)

- 1. Meet with your high school counselor or school official to complete this form.
- 2. Apply for admission to Highline College at admissions.highline.edu/apply and activate your MyHighline account.
- 3. Visit Highline College's <u>Placement and Testing Center</u> to complete your English and/or math placement as needed.
- 4. Complete the appropriate New Student Orientation.
- 5. Schedule an appointment with an advisor to register for classes.
- 6. Pay tuition and fees. If you are 19 years or older and a Washington state resident, you may be qualified for reduced tuition.
