Please submit the following documents to the ISP office:

- International Student Application form
- \$54 application fee
- Bank statement showing at least USD\$20,000 in funds
- Copy of passport
- Proof of English proficiency from the following options:
 - ⇒ TOEFL score of 54/157/480
 - ⇒ IELTS score of 5.5 in all sections

Shih Chien University, located in beautiful Taipei, Taiwan, was founded in 1958. The name “Shih Chien,” which in Chinese means “practice,” was originated from the belief of Wang Yung Ming, a great Chinese philosopher: “Knowledge is the beginning of practice. Doing is the completion of knowing” (1498).

Shih Chien seeks to provide its students with an educational experience characterized by incorporation of tradition and modernization, the integration of humanities with technology, and the development of local-global perspectives.

Highline to Shih Chien University Transfer

Area of Study: International Business (language of instruction is English)

All applicants must:

- Meet with an ISP advisor to check eligibility
- Be on track to complete an Associate of Arts or Associate of Business with a 2.5 GPA to apply
- Provide proof of English proficiency (native and non-native speakers of English) in one of the following ways:
 - IELTS 5.5 (only non-native speakers)
 - TOEFL 71 or equivalency of TOEIC (only non-native speakers)
 - Minimum 2.5 GPA in English 101 and 205 at Highline College with admission interview by SCU (both native and non-native speakers)

Application Documents

- 2 passport-sized photos
- Color photocopy of passport
- Official transcripts (with English translation if necessary) including all courses from the university and official school stamp
- Bank statement from a financial institution with a minimum balance of US\$4,000; if the financial statement does not bear the name of the applicant, the owner must also provide a sponsor’s financial guarantee
- 2 letters of recommendation (by professor or industry)
- Statement of Purpose (Study Plan)
- C.V. or Autobiography
- English Proficiency proof

Please meet with an ISP advisor after collecting all documents for a final check. When approved, Highline will send program recommendation to SCU.

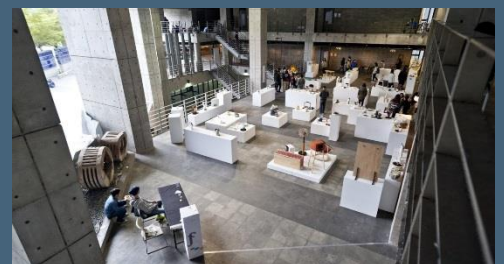
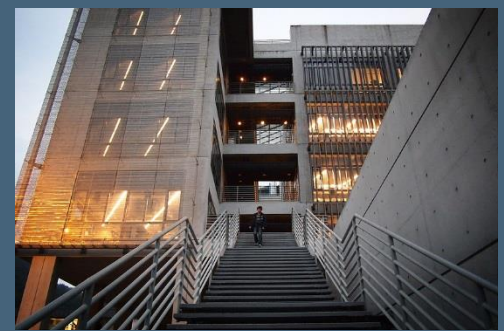
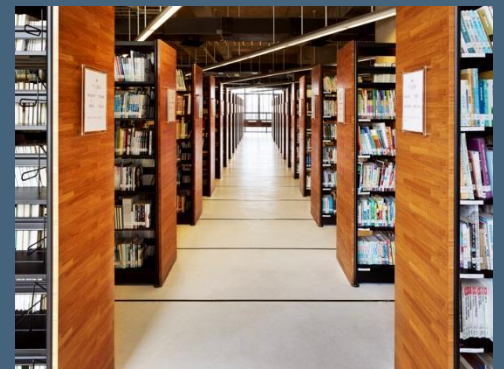
Tuition, Fees and Living Expenses
