SHORT-TERM PROGRAMS

Expectations

- International students must enroll in <u>at least 12 credits</u> and no more than 18 credits per quarter
 - At least 7 credits must be in the classroom
 - Online classes are not recommended.

Registration Timeline:

- Registration begins in the previous quarter and international students can register one day before all students
- It is possible to change classes, but students must finalize their schedule by the end of the first week

SUMMER Late June-Mid August (8 weeks)

FALL Late September-Mid December (12 weeks)

WINTER Early January-Late March (11 weeks)
SPRING Early April-Mid June (11 weeks)

<u>Internship Option – Minimum 2 Quarters</u>

- Step 1: Take BUSN 139 or HOST 139

 Learn about resume/cover letter writing, interviewing & networking
- Step 2: Finalize resume and attend the required ISP Internship Workshop
- Step 3: Work hard and send applications to find your own internship
- Step 4: After being hired, complete the ISP Internship Registration Form
- Step 5: When you are done, have your internship supervisor sign the ISP Internship Completion Form
- Step 6: Submit your ISP Internship Completion Form to ISP to earn your ISP Internship Certificate

*Students are required to take BUSN/HOST 139 in order to participate in an internship.
