Program description

The Substance Use Disorder Professional (SUDP) specializes in working with individuals to help them overcome their dependency on alcohol and drugs to become self-sufficient. A SUDP is certified by the Washington State Department of health to provide assessment, treatment and recovery services to individuals, groups and families.

This is an accelerated training to become a Substance Use Disorder Professional (SUDP) for Behavioral Health Professionals holding a master's degree or beyond. The 15 credits are entirely online for eligible students who are interested in becoming an SUDP through the Alternative Training pathway. Students must hold an active license in good standing in the areas of the WAC 246-811-076.
