Applying to the Registered Nursing AAS 2024-2025 Application Cycle

Preparing to apply to the Registered Nursing AAS at Highline can take 1-2 years. Students must complete certain courses, earn a Nursing Assistant Certificate, and take the TEAS exam. It's important to understand that this AAS is a selective admission program—not everyone who applies is admitted.

Complete Required Coursework

Coursework required to apply amounts to 4-6 quarters, or 1-2 years of study. Except for MATH& 146, these courses must be passed with at least a 3.0 GPA, and students cannot attempt them more than 3 times.

- BIOL& 241 Human Anatomy and Physiology I
- BIOL& 242 Human Anatomy and Physiology II
- BIOL& 260 Microbiology
- CHEM& 121 Introduction to Chemistry
- ENGL& 101 English Composition I
- PSYC& 200 Lifespan Developmental Psychology
- MATH& 146 Introduction to Statistics (minimum grade is 2.7 GPA)
- NUTR& 101 Nutrition (New requirement the 2024-2025 academic year)
- CMST 200-Level or Above (New requirement for the 2024-2025 academic year)

Some of these courses have prerequisites students must complete first:

- BIOL& 160 General Biology with Lab for Pre-Allied Health Students (Prerequisite to BIOL& 241 and BIOL& 260, minimum grade is 2.0 GPA)
- PSYC& 100 General Psychology (Prerequisite to PSYC& 200, minimum grade is 1.0 GPA)
- If you do not have a math placement of MATH 107, 111, 146, 180, or 98, then you must take either:
 - MATH 91 Intermediate Algebra (Prerequisite to MATH& 146, minimum grade is 2.0 GPA), or
 - MATHP 146 Introduction to Statistics with Extra Support (minimum grade is 2.7 GPA)

Note: Financial aid won't typically fund classes taken outside a degree program. This includes classes taken to prepare for applying to a program like the Registered Nursing AAS. However, students may be able to receive funding through Workforce Education Services (WES).

Earn a Nursing Assistant Certificate

Students can earn a Nursing Assistant Certificate through Highline's Certified Nursing Assistant Theory and Practicum Program. It's an intensive 4-week program that prepares students to take the WA State Licensure exam. Students spend 3 weeks learning in a classroom, and a 4th week learning hands-on skills at a clinical site. To enroll in the program, students must:

- Be at an ESL level of 4 or above
- Provide a negative tuberculosis (TB) test
- Pass a criminal background check

The program isn't covered by most financial aid sources. However, students may be able to receive funding through Workforce Education Services (WES).

TEAS Exam

Students must score a total of 75, with at least 70 in each category, on the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) exam. The exam tests a student's reading, mathematics, science, and English language skills.

It's recommended that students start studying 6 months before they plan to apply to the AAS and take the exam 3 months before. This leaves time to retake the exam if needed. Highline has a <u>TEAS Exam Preparation Canvas</u> course to help students study. Students can retake the exam as many times as they like. Keep in mind that other colleges may not accept scores from retaken exams. The exam costs about \$120 each time it is taken.

Apply

Visit the <u>Registered Nursing AAS admissions page</u> to find the next application deadline and a link to the application form. There is a \$45 fee to apply. The application will need to include:

- Unofficial transcript showing the required courses
- Nursing Assistant Certificate of Completion
- TEAS exams results (total score of 75+, with 70+ in each category)
- Vaccination records (Hepatitis B, Td/Tdap, MMR, Varicella, Covid-19 with booster, Flu, and TB)

Next Steps

Even after completing every step of the application pathway, a student might not be accepted into the nursing program at Highline. Only 28 students are accepted each quarter. Students should know that they might still be selected within the next two quarters—they don't need to reapply to be considered. Students might also be added to a waitlist and then admitted if a new spot becomes available.

If a student ultimately isn't admitted, though, they still have healthcare career pathways open to them. Students can choose to apply to other nursing programs. Keep in mind that other colleges may have different admission requirements. Local colleges with nursing programs include:

- Bellevue College
- Pierce College
- Renton College
- Green River College
- Seattle Central
- Tacoma Community College

If a student prefers to continue at Highline, they could pursue a <u>BAS in Respiratory Care</u>. After completing all the Registered Nursing AAS prerequisites, a student only needs to take ENGL& 102 or ENGL& 235 before they can apply to the BAS. Once admitted, they can complete the degree in 3 years of full-time study.

Or students can complete an <u>Associate in Pre-Nursing (DTA/MRP)</u>. This is a pathway toward transferring into a BS in Nursing at a university. Local universities offering BSNs include Seattle University, Seattle Pacific University, University of Washington, and Pacific Lutheran University. If a student has completed all the Registered Nursing AAS prerequisites, they will need to take 30 more credits to complete the AA-DTA:

- ENGL& 102, CHEM& 131, and PE 101
- 10 Credits from the Humanities Distribution
- 5 Credits from the Social Sciences Distribution

A student could also start immediately in a Healthcare Professions program:

- The Medical Assistant AAS could be completed in 81 credits (about 2 years full-time)
- The Community Health & Wellness AAS could be completed in 67 credits (about 1 ½ years full-time)
