English	<p>English &101 and above (Except English 110) <i>Classes below may not satisfy NCAA or four-year college entrance requirements:</i> Communication Studies &101, &102, 200, 205, &210, &220, &230; Journalism 101, 115</p>
Math	<p>Math &107 and above <i>Classes below may not satisfy NCAA or four-year college entrance requirements:</i> MATH &180, &181 Philosophy &120 Business 135* (with approval from high school counselor)</p>
Washington State History	History &214
U.S. History	<p>History 115, &146, &147, &148, 225 Ethnic and Gender Studies 137, 142, 150</p>
Contemporary World History	<p>Diversity & Global Studies 110, 160; Economics 110, &201, &202; Geography 120, 200, 205; History 103, 160, 260, 273; Philosophy 110, 150; Political Science 101 and higher; Sociology 101 and higher</p>
Civics	Political Science: 275, &201, &202, &204
Social Studies Elective	<p>Courses which meet Highline’s ‘Social Sciences’ requirement as outlined on the Associate in Arts - DTA. Plus, the following courses: Philosophy &101, 110, 115, 145</p>
Lab Science	Courses which meet Highline’s ‘Life and Physical Science’ lab requirement as outlined on the Associate in Art - DTA.
Non-lab Science	Courses which meet Highline’s ‘Life and Physical Science’ but do not include a lab component as outlined on the Associate in Art - DTA.
Health	Physical Education 100, 101, 160; Nutrition &101
Physical Education	<p>Any PE Activity or fitness courses. <i>Non-activity courses that will NOT apply as PE activity are: PE 100, 101, 160, 171, 189.</i></p>
Career and Technical Education/ Occupational Education	<p>Any 100 and above level course taken from the following disciplines: Accounting, Business, Business Technology, Criminal Justice, Computer Info Systems, Computer Science, Drafty, Early Child Education, Engineering, Hospitality and Tourism Management, Human Services, Healthcare Professions, Interior Design, Legal Studies/Paralegal, Library Technology, Multimedia Design, Nursing Assistant, Optical Licensed Dispensing, Personal Fitness Trainer, Respiratory Care, Visual Communications Plus the following course: Career 110</p>

Fine/Performing Arts	Any 100 and above level course in Art or Music
World Language	Any American Sign Language, Arabic, Chinese, French, Japanese, or Spanish.
Other Electives	100 level and above courses that are not listed above are elective courses and will be transferred as elective credits.
